From the keyboard of the New President:

Hello members of the Palos Verdes/South Bay Alumni Chapter of Mu Phi Epsilon! This is Lorna Katz, your newly elected President! I want to thank you for allowing me the honor of serving you during our new fiscal year. I am looking forward to meeting you and to greeting each of you in person. To get things started, I was asked to write something for the newsletter, so I thought maybe you would like to know a little bit about myself, as well as let you know what plans I have for our chapter.

I am originally from Hawaii, born in Waimea on the island Kauai. I grew up in Honolulu, where I graduated from Farrington High school in 1979. While in high school, I was very active in orchestra, marching band, choir, and theater. During my sophomore year in high school, I was selected to take part in the Honolulu Youth Choir, comprised of the best choral students from each high school on Oahu.

In 1982, I moved to California with my first husband and raised two daughters, Jennifer who was born in 1984, and Toni who was born in 1986. I worked as an accounting clerk at various manufacturing companies from 1984 to 1998, but music continued to always be a big part of my life. I was part of the worship team at Hope Chapel in Torrance in 1988 and became the worship leader from 1990 to 1998, having written many of the worship songs that were sung during our church services. During this time, I co-produced the church's worship album, "One Worship." In 1997, I caught the attention of radio personality Dave Parks, also known as "K-Dave," of KWVE 107.9 FM, when I submitted my children's Christian song "Touch" to the radio station. Out of this, my solo album, *LornaJean and the Jellybean Club* was born. My songs were featured regularly on the Saturday Morning Kids Show with K-Dave and Company. I briefly toured southern California with the K-Dave and Company Show, performing for many children.

In 1999, I changed careers from a pencil pushing accounting clerk to becoming an actor. I have been a member of SAG-AFTRA since 2001, having appeared in numerous television shows, featured films, music videos, commercials, and print jobs. A list of my credits can be found on IMDB.com under Lorna Jean Katz. Most of my work was as a

background actor. I became a regular as a hospital administrator on Fox's hit show, "House M.D." (2004 – 2012) with Hugh Laurie. After that show had wrapped, I appeared as a bar regular on TV Land's show, "Hot in Cleveland" (2010 – 2015) with Betty White, Valerie Bertinelli, Jane Leeves, and Wendie Malick.

I am also a member of Sweet Adelines International, an organization dedicated to performing and educating people in the art of acapella singing in the barbershop style. I have won an international gold medal in 2007 with the Harborlites Chorus, Region 21. During my membership with this organization, I have served as an Assistant Director with the L.A. South Towns Show Chorus, and later with the Golden Sands Chorus, (Region 11). I was the Education Coordinator for the San Diego Chorus, Region 21, in 2021. My duties included offering classes in music theory to the members, as well as scheduling various educators to come and give in-house seminars.

In 2015, I decided to fulfill my lifelong dream of getting my college degrees. I began attending music classes at El Camino College. I auditioned and was accepted to the Applied Music Program as a vocal performer. I graduated in 2018 with honors, with an AA in Music Performance – Voice. In 2018, I transferred to California State University Dominguez Hills to complete my BA in 2020. In the Spring of 2019, I joined the Gamma Sigma chapter. I then became president of the chapter later that same semester and served until Spring 2020, my Senior year. I graduated with my BA in Music Performance – Voice, Magna Cum Laude. In addition, I was also invited to join Phi Kappa Phi, having graduated in the top five percent of my class. Presently, I am a grad student at CSUF, pursuing a MM in music theory and composition studying with Dr. Pamela Madsen. I will be graduating in Fall 2022. It is my hope to continue my education in pursuing a doctorate in the same discipline.

As your president, I hope to expand performance opportunities for our alumni members, bring about more education within our chapter in the use of computer technology, such as creating music videos and recordings, and to continue to serve our community through music. Since the pandemic forced schools to be taught virtually through zoom, I have gained many skills in video creation, editing, and posting on platforms such as YouTube. I would like to hopefully teach a basic skills class in creating music videos class for our members soon.

Thank you for putting your faith and trust in me as your incoming president. Should you have any questions, do not hesitate to send me an email. If I cannot answer your questions, I will make sure I will find the answers from one our board members.
